Olga Macingwane travelled to Pretoria Central Prison to meet Stefaans Coetzee, one of the men involved in the December 1997 Worcester Bombing. Her forgiveness of Stefaans led to the Peace Train in which a group of survivors of the bombing travelled from Worcester on a Reconciliation journey to Pretoria Prison.

Ginn Fourie's daughter Lyndi, a student at UCT was killed in an attack on the Heidleberg Pub in Cape Town in Dec 1993. Letlapa Mphahlele, then Director of Operations of APLA, the military wing of the PAC, took full responsibility for the attack. Today Ginn and Letlapa as co-founders of the Lyndi Fourie Foundation travel together across the globe with their message of forgiveness and conciliation.
