## Strategic matters addressed in budget

The Executive Management (EM) approved the 2006 budget for the UFS, which reflects a leveling off in income growth, though at a level that still allows for significant expenditure of R69,3 million for strategic matters. But there will not be sufficient funds to continue the rapid growth in respect of allocations for provisioning and services, Senior Lecturer Equivalent (SLE) and salaries, says Prof. Niel Viljoen, Chief Director: Operations.

The 2006 budget will be submitted to the Council for final approval. There were several new realities influencing the 2006 budget, including:

- Student numbers have stabilised
- The inflation rate is the lowest ever
- The effects of government's new funding framework that imposes a limit on the number of students it will subsidise
- The expected drop in the number of school leavers generally as well as those that will qualify for university admission.

"As a result of this a further increase in student numbers on the Main Campus in Bloemfontein will probably not be possible. Increasing student numbers at the Qwaqwa Campus of the UFS, is of course, still very important," he added.

More optimal utilisation of the new funding framework, for example through higher through-put rates, is very important for strategic reasons, but will unfortunately not result in substantial financial relief.

"The challenge is therefore to focus on increasing the so-called third stream income, as well as the recruitment of

non-traditional and non-subsidised students."

The main recommendations which were approved by the EM are:

- Because of the leveling off in income and the fact that salary increases also still need to be financed from this, it was recommended that no additional funds should be allocated for SLE increases.
- As far as the distribution of SLE's among faculties is concerned. The matter will be investigated further by the Budget Division. Several other universities were consulted on this matter, but due to the uncertainty regarding the effect of the new funding framework, it would appear

as if most of the universities will maintain the status quo.

- Regarding the support services, practically all available SLE's have been allocated already. If new services have to be provided, a shift will have to be made with regard to allocations rather than new allocations made. This is because the leveling off in student numbers is also likely to lessen the pressure on these services. A few requests with exceptional merit were indeed granted.

In line with the lower income growth and growth in student numbers a three percent increase for goods and services has been approved.

## Intellectual property will now be protected

The Senate of the UFS approved the Intellectual Property Policy aimed at creating an enabling environment and encouraging staff and students to do research. The policy protects the new innovations generated by research in the academic world, and of all personnel at the UFS.

"This policy attempts to create a win-win situation to benefit the university as well as the creator or inventor of the idea," says Prof. Van Aardt Smit of the Department of Business Management.

He said: "The purpose of the policy is to enable the UFS to protect, patent, exploit and commercialise intellectual property to the advantage of the university, the inventor, the local community and the country as a whole. To ensure this, sufficient mechanisms have to be put in place. Employees have contracts that stipulate that whatever they develop belongs to the university. Students

in postgraduate studies also have the same obligation.

"In the past, master's and doctoral students conceded copyright when the final dissertation/ thesis was submitted but, according to the new policy, intellectual property rights will be conceded to the university on registration."

The legal position regarding ownership of intellectual property created by an employee within the scope of his employment is defined in his conditions of service. In terms of the standard service contract, a staff member assigns and concedes to the UFS, without counter value, all immaterial property rights that he, acting within the scope of his employment as an employee of the UFS, becomes entitled to in future. The policy does however, provide for a fair and realistic split of the benefits derived from the commercialisation of the intellectual property.

"Intellectual property that results from private work, approved by the dean, does not belong to the university, but to the creator. Private work may not take up more than one day per week during an employee's normal working hours," says Prof. Smit.

He says, the concept intellectual property includes inventions, discoveries, registered and unregistered trademarks and names, registered designs and models, circuit layouts, trade secrets, confidential information, plant breeder's rights, and all rights resulting from intellectual activities in the field of industry, science, literature and arts.

Dr Adi Paterson of the Department of Science and Technology said: "The policy is in line with government's intention to force universities to protect the intellectual property created by both students and employees at all South African universities."

# UFS grows its own timber

The UFS are preparing graduate students for their future in academic careers. This is done in the Grow our own Timber Programme. The main goal is to provide opportunities for young black graduate students to acquire their Ph.D. degree and to introduce them to issues surrounding university teaching and faculty worklife in research and non-research settings.

Recently students from this programme presented their research topics to a panel of judges. Respectively Ms Lucia Motseki in the Department Human Nutrition, Mr Ancel George in the Department Psychology and Ms Rebotsamang Shago in the Department Chemistry was appointed as overall third prize, second prize and first prize winners.

Ms Annette Prins of the Centre for Higher Education Studies and Development said: "We are proud of the fellows and are keenly awaiting the completion of their studies and their possible appointment as UFS academics."

# UFS assists with training of new generation of municipal managers

The Unit for Local Government and Management in the Department of Public Management at the UFS presented a programme specifically aimed at assisting municipal managers and officials. The Executive Municipal Management Development Programme is a unique inter-disciplinary training and development programme.

Prof. Koos Bekker, Project Manager of the programme said: "The programme was started by the national government in support of struggling municipalities to smarten up their service delivery.

"Our aim with the programme is to teach students mentor and training skills and to assist them to apply it as part of an integral strategic budgeting and performance management approach. Mentorship is an unexploited leadership style that can turn the current situation of municipalities around to a successful sphere of governance. A network of well trained

mentors and facilitators can therefore be created. They can provide support and in-service training at municipalities and act as partners of the UFS in training programmes."

The programme consists of 15 short learning modules which are accredited within the framework of the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA). It is a tough course. Students' knowledge is tested frequently and the minimum passing rate is 70%. Students who do not maintain this may not complete the course. "We set the standard so high to attract people with potential who are committed to development," said Prof Bekker.

The Executive Municipal Management Development Programme is a joint project of the Department of Local Government and Housing, the South African Society of Local Government (Free State) and the UFS Public Sector Management Programme. The project is funded by the Flemish government.

## Housing strategy must make room for special needs

South Africa's housing strategy must devote attention to people with special needs, including people with disabilities, people living with HIV/AIDS and those in poverty.

This was the view expressed by Dr Mark Napier of the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research during his presentation to the Housing Research Day organised by the Centre for Development Support at the UFS. Dr Napier was involved in shaping the *Breaking New Ground* housing strategy of Minister Lindiwe Sisulu.

According to him, housing delivery faces challenges which need to be addressed. That includes the withdrawal of larger construction firms; the slow process of developing an emerging contractor sector, access to bridging and other finance, and the acquisition of well located (especially inner city) land.

Dr Napier said: "The *Breaking new Ground* strategy tries to go beyond the provision of basic shelter to the establishment of sustainable settlements and to be responsive to housing demand rather than being supply led.

He said a survey of people who had benefited from government's housing programme had shown mixed results. Although the location of the houses was poor and there were increased costs, most beneficiaries said they were better off than before. They said that they had very little personal choice between houses, sites or settlements. Beneficiaries also felt that municipalities and developers fail to repair defective houses. Many beneficiaries also reported that they felt unsafe in their settlements, as well as in their own houses.

Prof. Lucius Botes, the Director of the Centre for Development Support, said: "The Research Day highlighted the Centre's ability to interact with problems faced by communities, the government, the private sector and civil society. Through our research we can ensure that the UFS is engaged with our people's problems and challenges and as a place of scholarship, is enabled to assist in finding solutions."

# Prof. Scott and Spanish connection research climate changes in Namib

**G**raciela Gil Romera from the Autonomous University of Madrid in Spain visited the Department of Plant Sciences at the UFS as part of her Ph.D. study in palynology (the microscopic study of pollen grains). She is focussing her project on long-term vegetation and climate change in the Namib Desert over the last 10 000 years and further back in time.

She obtained unique information about past climates from the pollen composition of fossil dung accumulations produced by hyraxes (dassies), which escape decomposition for thousands of years under special desert conditions. In September Graciela accompanied Prof. Louis Scott of the Department of Plant Sciences and Mr Eugene Marais of the National Museum of Namibia in Windhoek on an expedition transecting most of the Namib Desert to collect samples for radiocarbon dating and pollen analysis. The research is part of an international project in which Prof. George Brook from Athens, Georgia, USA, is a participant.

## Fakulteit Teologie sorg vir talle eerstes



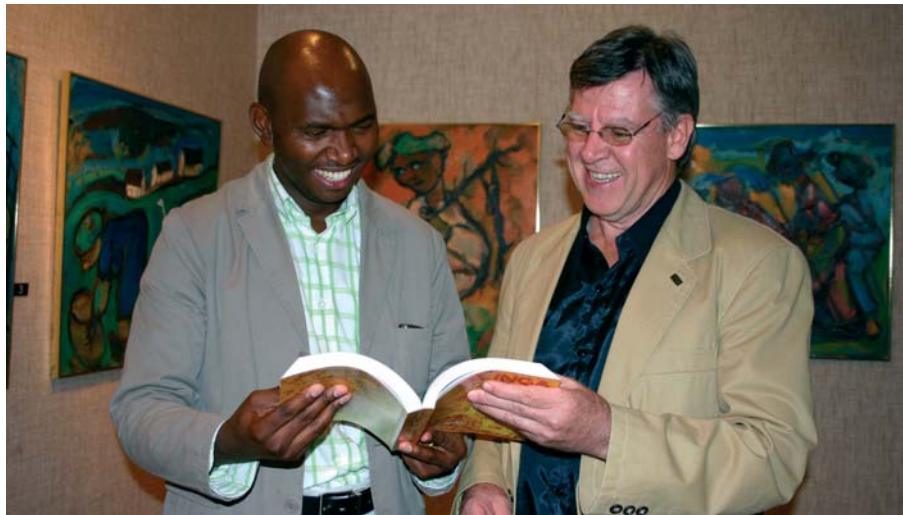

Die Fakulteit Teologie aan die UV het verskeie eerstes behaal met die besoek van prof. Wilhelm Neuser van Münster, Duitsland. Dié 79-jarige professor het met die lentegradeplegtigheid van die UV 'n eredoktorsgraad in Teologie ontvang. Op die vooraand van die plegtigheid het hy 'n gaslesing by die Fakulteit Teologie gegee. Prof. Dolf Britz van die Departement Eklesiologie sê: "Dit is die eerste keer aan die UV dat 'n persoon wat 'n eredoktorsgraad ontvang, 'n spesiale gaslesing vooraf gee.

"Die aand is op 'n hoogtepunt afgesluit toe prof. Neuser 'n skenking aan prof. Hermie van Zyl, Dekaan van die Fakulteit Teologie, oorhandig het. Die skenking gaan aangewend word vir navorsing rakende Calvyn se werke, veral met die oog op die vertaling van Calvyn se kommentare in Afrikaans en Suid-Sotho. Dit is die eerste skenking van hierdie aard wat die fakulteit ontvang het. Verder sal dit die eerste keer wees dat Calvyn se kommentare in Afrikaans en Suid-Sotho vertaal word.

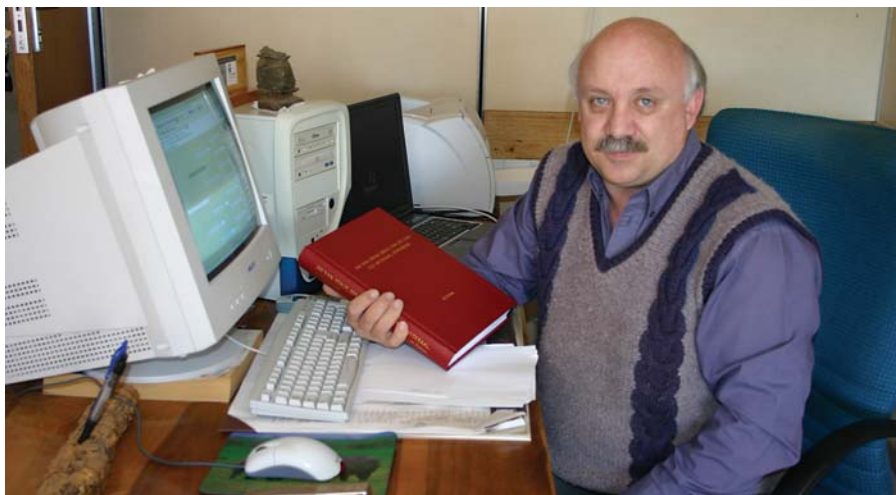
## Nomineer vir die Kovsie Alumni toekennings

Die geslagsregister het hom 30 maande besig gehou, 24 maande vir navorsing en ses maande vir die skryfwerk. ## Six tell about research

Staff from the Department of Afro-Asiatic Studies and Language Practice and Sign Language at the UFS delivered 38 papers so far this year.

## Prof. Raath presteer buitengewoon

Prof. Andries Raath van die Departement Staatsreg en Regsfilosofie in die Fakulteit Regsgeleerdheid aan die UV het 'n merkwaardige akademiese prestasie behaal toe sy akademiese besonderhede in die *Who's who in the world, twenty-second edition, 2005*, gepubliseer is. Die internasionale verwysingsbron oor uitstaande intellektuele prestasies verskyn reeds sedert 1898 en verleen erkenning en maak toekennings aan individue wat prestasies in hul velde van belangstelling behaal en daardeur betekenisvol bydra tot die verbetering van die kontemporêre gemeenskap.

Oor die eer wat hom te beurt geval het, sê prof. Raath: "Ek is dankbaar dat die UV en die Fakulteit Regsgeleerdheid akademies internasionaal figureer."

Hy is ook deur die International Biographical Centre in Cambridge, Engeland, vir sy bydraes op die terrein van die regte, filosofie en geskiedenis vereer. Daar is slegs 2 000 mense wêreldwyd wat toekennings, insluitend 'n medalje vir buitengewone prestasie, ontvang. Die diploma en medalje wat aan prof. Raath toegeken is, vermeld dat hy een van die uitstaande intellektuele in 2005 is.

Die toekennings aan prof. Raath is gemaak op grond van akademiese bydraes wat in internasionale publikasies verskyn het oor die ontwikkeling van die vroeg-moderne konsep van demokrasie, die regstaat en regsontwikkeling wat 'n belangrike impak in die vroeg-Reformatoriese en vroeg-moderne tydperk sedert 1500 gehad het.
