Post description of Senior Learning Facilitator

Learning facilitation means to facilitate the learning process for the learners (university students) by providing academic assistance. The learning facilitator is not a lecturer and subject knowledge is not taught to the student.

The facilitator's task/role is to manage the learning process of the students by, among others, laying down guidelines (structure), giving the student the opportunity to discover subject knowledge for himself/herself and to make it part of his/her life-world, and to accept responsibility for his/her own studies. By teaching the learners skills, they can be developed academically. Skills include oral communication (arguments, viewpoints, and reasoning), writing skills, and adult learning skills. Utilizing a positive attitude on the part of a learning facilitator, a good attitude and feeling for the subject can be developed in the learner.

The method employed for learning facilitation is in an informal learning environment where students can discuss among other themes, test questions, and assignments in groups, whereby they not only learn about each other but also become actively involved in the learning process.

Apart from the academic role of the learning facilitator, he/she also has administrative tasks aimed at aiding the lecturer. The following administrative tasks are performed: The learning facilitator must be au fait with the content of the course, as input is required with respect to planning for group learning sessions. Must be available for additional consultation times for students. Marking tests, evaluation of assignments, and other tasks. Computer processing of marks. Feedback to the lecturer or course coordinator concerned regarding trends, problems, and remarks on students.

Post description of Course Coordinator

In the Career Preparation Program, Political Science is one of the subjects being taught at the first-year level. The Career Preparation Program expands to many different regions and sub-regions over the country. In the Career Preparation Program, the Course Coordinator is the focal point.

The following explanation gives a summary of the responsibilities and duties of the Course Coordinator:

- Develop and write course guides.
- Identify an appropriate textbook and study material.
- Compile the facilitators' guide for facilitators in the sub-regions.
- Compile timetables.
- Appoint suitable facilitators in each region and the continuous contact and training of the facilitators.
- Continues visits to the sub-regions and facilitators.
- To acquire class lists from the main frame of the administration of students registered for the module per region.
- Assessment, including compiling tests and different class evaluation activities.
- Compile the memorandum for the facilitators to mark the different assessment activities.
- Moderate tests and assignments marked by the facilitators at the sub-regions.
- Revise the different reports and results from the assessment activities of the different regions.
- Revising and interpreting the student's evaluation of the specific module.
- Revise the term reports of each sub-region and address problems and questions.
- Finalizing marks and the electronically transferring of marks to the mainframe at the administration.
- The attendance of term meetings by the course coordinators and report back to the academic department.
- The attendance of training and elucidation of sessions.

Philosophy and Approach

6. Provide research-informed facilitation to ensure practice-based learning, (blended learning approach online)
7. Responsible for quality of programmes (quality assurance and rules of the faculty to adhere to).
8. Manage circulation processes after the external reviews.
9. Monitor the performance of the students and the lecturers.
10. Using the latest technology and systems online including Blackboard.
11. Provide guidance of the lecturers who teach modules from other faculties.
12. Academic advice in terms of academic inquiries especially for the undergraduate students (BA Governance Students).
13. Changes to the Faculties rulebooks and make suggestions to General rules. Verify the timetable of undergraduate students to make sure that no classes clash.
14. Adhere to the rules and regulations of the Faculty Humanities.
15. Practice strategic thinking and good organizational ability to plan different events and look at new modules and planning.
16. Leading in terms of understanding the needs of the students and the feelings of others interacting with other staff members, building coalitions, and working with colleagues across faculties to improve and adjust the qualifications.
17. Responsible for the marketing of the programmes in Governance and Political Transformation. Looking at the webpage, videos, alumni, and general marketing of the programmes of Governance.
