#### 2. OVERVIEW

Hendrik Auret is a professional architect and academic. His research interests revolve around finding architectural moments that reveal the distinct concerned relationships between dwellers and their emplaced existence as instances of care, thereby making the case for attentive, appropriate ways of designing and building able to dignify this lived totality. Architecture as an art of care. Hendrik obtained the degree BArchStud (cum laude) in 2004, BArchStud(Hons) (cum laude) in 2005 and the degree MArch(Prof) (cum laude) in 2006. All from the University of the Free State (UFS). His master's design dissertation won the 2006 National Corobrik Architectural Student of the Year Award, the title accorded the best dissertation from all South African Architecture learning sites. This project was included in 'Ora Joubert's book, 10+ Years 100+ Projects: Architecture in a Democratic South Africa (2017).

Hendrik began his career as a candidate architect with Roodt Architects in 2007 before accepting a junior lectureship at his alma mater in 2009. This was followed by a sojourn in Canada, 2010-2013, during which time he commenced his PhD degree and was a studio instructor at the University of Calgary, Department of Environmental Design. On repatriation in 2014 and submitting his thesis, he re-joined Roodt Architects as a professional architect. In 2015 he obtained a PhD (with specialisation in architecture) from the University of the Free State.

From 2016 to 2019 Hendrik served as a postdoctoral research fellow and a part-time senior lecturer at the UFS Department of Architecture. He published several peer-reviewed articles and delivered public lectures including: a peer-reviewed congress presentation at the 2014 XXV UIA Congress of Architecture (Durban), lectures at the 2015 and 2018 Sophia Gray Mini-Congresses (Bloemfontein) and guest lectures at the University of Calgary (2012) and the Oslo School of Architecture and Design (AHO, 2017). During January and February 2017 Hendrik visited the AHO in Oslo as guest researcher. In 2019 Routledge published his first book, Christian Norberg-Schulz's Interpretation of Heidegger's Philosophy: Care, Place and Architecture. Since January 2020 Auret has been appointed a full-time Senior Lecturer at the UFS. Since February 2020 he has served as chairperson of the Permit Committee of the Free State Provincial Heritage Resources Authority. In the same year he was also awarded a Y2 rating from the National Research Foundation (NRF).







- a. **Professional registration:** Since November 2008 I have been registered as a Professional Architect with the South African Council for the Architectural Profession (SACAP).
- b. **National Research Foundation Rating:** In 2020 I was awarded a **Y2 rating** from the National Research Foundation (NRF).
- c. **Heritage activities:** Since January 2017 I have served as member of the Permit Committee of the Free State Provincial Heritage Resources Authority.

  In February 2020 I was appointed as chairperson of the Permit Committee of the Free State Provincial Heritage Resources Authority.
  - Free State Psychiatric Complex (in collaboration with Kobus du Preez): In 2017 we compiled a decisive heritage assessment report on a group of abandoned buildings on the grounds of the Free State Psychiatric Complex. Our research revealed that these buildings played a pioneering role in the psychiatric care of black patients in the Free State and (for now) saved the ensemble from obscurity and demolition.
  - The President M.T. Steyn Statue (in collaboration with Kobus du Preez): The UFS, as part of a global movement, is trying to respond appropriately to the shifting meanings of monuments on their campuses. One such contested monument was the statue of President M.T. Steyn in front of the Main Building. In line with heritage laws, yet cognizant of the concerns of current students, the University approached the Permit Committee (PC) of the Free State Provincial Heritage Resources Authority for guidance. As a member of the PC, I challenged the University task team to create on opportunity for interest groups to critically re-consider the statue by adding a new work of art provoking alternative narratives and conditions. I designed a triangular reflective prism to illustrate my point. The prism's reflective surface visually 'removed' the statue from its power position on the historical axis without rendering it inaccessible. Despite being intended merely as an illustration, the task team endorsed the proposal and constructed the prism, which served as catalyst for a very engaging public participation process. The project, implemented by Mr Kobus du Preez, received a Free State Institute of Architects Merit Award.





- **Westdene:** In 2018 I organised a conservation survey by UFS postgraduate architecture students of several blocks of Westdene in order to record heritage resources and assess the state of the neighbourhood as potential 'heritage area'.
- **King Edward VII Park, Bfn:** During 2018 I presented a lecture on the historical significance of King Edward VII Park to key role players of Mangaung Metro's strategic planning office as a first step to dissuade irresponsible development of the park. In 2021, as part of a postgraduate studio project, the outlines of the Old Rose Garden in King's Park was traced and rescripted to raise public awareness about the potential of the space (which is under threat of development). #### **Hendrik Andries Auret**

I write as principal supervisor of the PhD thesis of Hendrik Auret.

I have known of Auret since 2006 when his Master's design dissertation was adjudged best from all South African Architecture learning sites and which earned him the coveted title 'Corobrik Architectural Student of the Year', an exceptional achievement.

However, our contact had to wait until I joined the staff of the University of the Free State (UFS) in 2010, and I was approached about supervision of his PhD thesis. Before accepting, to my astonishment I learnt that Auret had obtained the degree B.Arch.Stud. in 2004, B.Arch.Stud.(Hons) in 2005 and M.Arch.(Prof) in 2006, each with appellation cum laude!

It was during his student years at UFS, that Auret had been inspired by the writings of the Norwegian architect and theorist Norberg-Schulz (1926-2000). This prompted the topic for his PhD thesis, 'Care, place and architecture: a critical reading of Christian Norberg-Schulz's architectural interpretation of Martin Heidegger's philosophy', which considered the cogency of Norberg-Schulz's architectural 'translation' of the thinking of German philosopher Heidegger (1899-1976).

Supervision of the PhD thesis began in 2013, and with exemplary diligence and energy, Auret submitted in 2015. The two main external examiners approved the thesis without amendments, which was unusual, and advised that the thesis be published. This the renowned international publisher, Routledge, did in 2018, under the title *Christian Norberg-Schulz's Interpretation of Heidegger's Philosophy: Care, Place and Architecture*.

Having worked in a part-time capacity with leading Free State architectural practice, Roodt Architects, on conferment of the PhD degree, Dr Auret was appointed a Post-doctoral Research Fellow at UFS, in which he immersed himself in academia.

It is seldom that a student of Architecture with outstanding design ability is also outstandingly academically inclined, and therefore I have no hesitation in recommending Dr Auret for any position, whether in academia or in practice.
