Chantell has a MSc from the University of the Western Cape (UWC). She is a senior lecturer and is in her final year of her PhD at the North West University, South Africa.

Chantell's work experience spans 21 years in the public health sector and in multi-disciplinary and multi-cultural settings. Chantell's opportunity for in a senior position of leadership was catapulted in 2005 when she was headhunted by Helen Keller International as the Country Director for its largest country programme in Bangladesh. At the time, the country programme commanded a budget of almost US Dollars 2 million and an office staff of over 60. Chantell's strong technical skills in nutrition programming and analytical skills stood her well in steering the organization from August 2005-July 2008. Chantell worked closely with a competent team of twelve senior staff providing strategic leadership, stakeholder liaison and fundraising. Chantell co-chaired the INGO Network of 40 from 2006 until her departure in July 2008.

In October 2008, Chantell joined the Medical Research Council as a Senior Researcher coordinating and supporting the WHO Landscape Analysis for South Africa.
