RESEARCH STATEMENT:

1994

The return to run academia in tandem to practice has allowed Jeremy to merge what are often divergent disciplines. Key to his practice, teaching and research, is understanding how buildings inhabit an environment that constantly undergoes change, be it in city or rural landscapes. His work across a wide range of scales and typologies shows that architecture benefits from a continual dialogue and iterative participation between building and context.

Jeremy's 2019 PhD, entitled 'Unfinished Landscapes. How can an understanding of the New Zealand landscape as 'unfinished' inform residential architecture in the 21st century?", combines creative practice, actual practice and historical research to forward "Soft Architecture" as an approach where buildings are designed to participate with existing landscapes before generating new contexts. Building on New Zealand architecture being established in clearings rather than its original forested landscape, the thesis shows that in its unfinished landscapes (those landscapes where clearings have failed and now growing forests), it is buildings that require iterative refinishing rather than the landscape. We cannot afford to continue notionally 'mowing a lawn' around buildings so buildings do not need to change.

The key design project, Bach With Two Roofs, is recorded through change, first within growing trees, and then as a cyclone clears the forest. Its subsequent refinishing prepares the building to be iteratively changed and participate with a landscape now shifting to become a forest again. The constructed project won World Villa of the Year at the 2017 World Architecture Festival in Berlin, a 2018 NZIA New Zealand Architecture Award, has been presented in a series of international lectures, and published by Architecture Record amongst other accolades.

But with forests providing an analogy for cities, the lessons extend to urban landscapes where we continue to build in clearings amongst continual change. Post-doctoral research, practice and the iterative design *Ch-ch-ch-ch-changes* and *Borderless* Masters level studios at the University of Auckland forward this research to buildings in city landscapes. The *Ch-ch-ch-ch-changes* Studios investigate strategies for buildings to prompt, react and change in relation to time. The *Borderless* Studio forwards the proposition that if we can design buildings to ch-ch-ch-ch-change, the border relationships established in an attempt to control the landscape are now limiting our response.

The research continues to be innovative in establishing and recording theoretical and practical strategies where buildings might participate with shifting city landscapes and tackle sustainable issues of change through a variety of scales and disciplines. Whether world first carbon zero seismic resilient timber structures (SCION), old or new heritage (Nelson School of Music), public flexibility (Trafalgar Centre), environmental remediation (Mapua Waterfront Park), or those simply abandoned (Whakatane Library & Exhibition Centre), buildings are made to look to for prompts and to prepare for change.

If we stop building in clearings (and mowing the lawn around architecture), buildings must become soft and iteratively change in order to maintain a fit with shifting landscapes; *Being Finished is finished*.
