## REGULATIONS

These regulations are set out in part 1 of the General Calendar of the University, and deal with admission to the University, registration as student, requirements for passing, examinations, etc.

**Students should note that the General Regulations are applicable to all qualifications offered in the Faculty of Theology.**

**Regulations of the Faculty** apply specifically to degree and other programmes of this Faculty and are expounded in this Calendar.

The regulations according to which a student registers will be valid for the duration of his/her studies for that particular qualification.

*It is the responsibility of students to be well acquainted with the General Regulations as well as the Faculty Regulations.*

## Information

The Certificate in Theology offers a first encounter with theology to students whose matriculation results do not allow them to register directly for either the University Diploma in Theology or the B.Th. degree. It is also suitable for persons who wish to follow a so-called lay ministry in the church or who are interested in theology but who do not wish to continue with theological training after having completed the Certificate. However, the Certificate does grant access to the three-year University Diploma in Theology (study code 9011) with acknowledgement of this course as the first year.

## Admission

Senior Certificate issued by the South African Certification Council with or without endorsement (in 2007 or before) or a National Senior Certificate passed with an admission point (AP) 17-22 and the medium of instruction of choice (Afrikaans or English) passed with a minimum achievement level 4 (=50%) [from 2008] or after completion of three credit bearing modules of the Certificate and Diploma first year as short courses with a pass mark of 55% or more.

## Certificate cum laude

In order to obtain the Certificate cum laude, the average mark of all the modules must be 75% and the study must be completed in 18 months.

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## Information

The University Diploma in Theology (U.D.T.) offers an alternative theological training to students who do not qualify to register for the B.Th. degree. Some churches accept the U.D.T. as a route with a view to admission to the church ministry. After successfully completing the U.D.T. (three years) and the Advanced University Diploma in Theology (A.U.D.T.) (one year), a student may qualify to register for the B.A. Hons. (Theology) degree [see B.A. Hons. (Theology)]

**From 2008 first year students will only be allowed to enrol for the U.D.T. with the study code 9011. 2007 will be the last year in which first year students will be allowed to enrol for the U.D.T. with the study code 9010. It will systematically be phased out as the students move out of the system.**

## Admission

In order to be admitted to study for this Diploma, a candidate must have obtained a Senior Certificate of the standard required by the University (required M-score) or a Senior Certificate together with the Certificate in Theology of this Faculty (or an equivalent certificate or certificates).

The Faculty may impose additional requirements in terms of further school training and/or practical experience.

## Elucidation

A candidate for the University Diploma in Theology, who desires to be trained as a minister in his/her church, must consult with his/her denomination to determine whether the elective modules chosen are the correct selection required by his/her church. The student must also make certain that, where necessary, the applicable ecclesiastical bodies of his/her denomination can guide him/her.

### Diploma cum laude

- (i) In the fundamental and core modules, a combined mark of at least 75% must be obtained over the three years.
- (ii) In the minimum number of elective modules an average mark of at least 70% must be obtained over the three years.
- (iii) With regard to (i) and (ii) the credit value will operate as a factor in calculating the percentage.
- (iv) The diploma must be obtained in four years.

## CURRICULUM

The curriculum for this Diploma covers six semesters (three academic years) and the student must obtain at least 384 credits as prescribed (128 credits per year).

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## Information

The University Diploma in Theology (U.D.T.) offers an alternative theological training to students who do not qualify to register for the B.Th. degree. Some churches accept the U.D.T. as a route with a view to admission to the church ministry. After successfully completing the U.D.T. (three years), a student may qualify to register for the B.Th. or B.A. (Theology) and start with the second year.

**From 2008 first year students will only be allowed to enrol for the U.D.T. with the study code 9011. 2007 will be the last year in which first year students will be allowed to enrol for the U.D.T. with the study code 9010. It will systematically be phased out as the students move out of the system until 2012.**

## Admission

In order to be admitted to study for this diploma, a candidate must have obtained a Senior Certificate of the standard required by the University (required M-score of 24) (in 2007 and before); in terms of the National Senior Certificate (from 2008) an admission point (AP) of 23 with the language of instruction of choice (Afrikaans or English) passed at achievement level 4 (=50%) are required or a Certificate in Theology of this Faculty (or an equivalent certificate or certificates) which may give admission to the second year of the University Diploma in Theology.

## Elucidation

A candidate for the University Diploma in Theology, who desires to be trained as a minister in his/her church, must consult with his/her denomination to determine whether the elective modules chosen are the correct selection required by his/her church. The student must also make certain that, where necessary, the applicable ecclesiastical bodies of his/her denomination can guide him/her.

### Diploma cum laude

- (i) In the fundamental and core modules, a combined mark of at least 75% must be obtained over the three years.
- (ii) In the minimum number of elective modules an average mark of at least 70% must be obtained over the three years.
- (iii) With regard to (i) and (ii) the credit value will operate as a factor in calculating the percentage.
- (iv) The Diploma must be obtained in four years.

## Admission

In order to be admitted to study for the Advanced Diploma in Theology, a candidate must be in possession of a University Diploma in Theology or an equivalent qualification.

## Diploma cum laude

- (i) In the core modules and the minimum number of elective modules a combined mark of at least 75% must be obtained
- (ii) A calculating formula applies where the credit value applies as a calculating factor.
- (iii) The Diploma must be obtained in three semesters.

## CURRICULUM

The curriculum for this diploma is taken over two semesters (one academic year) and the student must obtain at least 128 credits as prescribed.

## Information

The Postgraduate Diploma in Theology (PDT) is a multi-purpose qualification that covers the broad spectrum of theological subjects. It may grant access to a master's degree. At the same time, in some churches that set additional requirements for undergraduate studies, it may grant access to the church ministry. The P.D.T. thus serves as a useful qualification on postgraduate level to complete shortcomings with a view to master's studies and church ministry.

## Admission

In order to be admitted to study for the Postgraduate Diploma, a student must be in possession of a professional or a four-year interdisciplinary B.Th. degree or an interdisciplinary B.A. Hons. (Theology) or an advanced B.Th. degree conferred by this university, or an equivalent qualification recognised by the Senate for this purpose.

The curriculum for this Postgraduate Diploma in Theology extends over two semesters (one academic year) and the student must obtain at least 128 credits as prescribed.

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## Information

The B.Th. is a professional programme that runs over four years. It is the ideal programme for students who wish to enter the ministry with a degree. The B.Th. offers a core curriculum for a variety of churches, covering the entire field of theology. Some churches require only three years of training. Even in these cases students need to register for the B.Th. degree [see B.A. (Theology)].

A candidate for the degree B.Th., who desires to be trained as a minister in his/her church, must consult with his/her denomination to determine whether the elective modules chosen are the correct selection required by his/her church so that, where necessary, the responsible ecclesiastical bodies of his/her denomination can guide him/her.

Qualifying tests involve a knowledge of the Bible and church doctrine and must be completed successfully in order to qualify for the degree.

The curriculum for this degree covers eight semesters (four academic years) and the student should obtain at least 512 credits (128 credits per year) as prescribed.

Where students are allowed a choice of modules, they should make certain that the class and examination time tables do not clash.

## Requirements for admission

It is the responsibility of students to make sure that they comply with the general regulations for admission. To be admitted to the B.Th. programme a student must have obtained a Senior Certificate with endorsement and a M-count of 28 (in 2007 or before) or in terms of the National Senior Certificate (from 2008) an admission point of 28 and the language of instruction of choice (Afrikaans or English) at achievement level 4 (=50%).

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### Information Extended Programme

The B.Th. (Extended Programme) runs over five years. It is the ideal programme for students who wish to enter the ministry with a degree and need some academic development. The B.Th. offers a core curriculum for a variety of churches, covering the entire field of theology.

A candidate for the degree B.Th., who desires to be trained as a minister in his/her church, must consult with his/her denomination to determine whether the elective modules chosen are the correct selection required by his/her church so that, where necessary, the responsible ecclesiastical bodies of his/her denomination can guide him/her.

Qualifying tests involve knowledge of the Bible and church doctrine and must be completed successfully in order to qualify for the degree.

The curriculum for this degree covers ten semesters (five academic years) and the student should obtain at least 640 credits (128 credits per year).

Where students are allowed a choice of modules, they should make certain that the class and examination time tables do not clash.

## Requirements for admission

It is the responsibility of students to make sure that they comply with the general regulations for admission. To be admitted to the Extended B.Th. Programme a student must have obtained a Senior Certificate with endorsement and a M-count of 24-27 (in 2007 or before) or in terms of the National Senior Certificate (from 2008) an admission point of 23-27 and the language of instruction of choice (Afrikaans or English) at achievement level 4 (=50%). With this achievement the student may alternatively enter the B.Th. Extended Programme or the University Diploma in Theology.

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## Information

The B.A. Hons. (Theology) enables the student to proceed from undergraduate to postgraduate studies in theology. The programme offers a specific finishing in theology and enables the student to serve in the ministry with greater proficiency. It also prepares the student for further specialisation on master's level. Depending on how the student's undergraduate studies were compiled, the degree may be followed in either one theological subject or more theological subjects.

## Admission

In order to be admitted to this degree study, a candidate must hold at least a three-year bachelor's degree in theology or an equivalent qualification.

This qualification can be obtained in either **one** discipline or **all six** disciplines.

For the course in **all six** theological disciplines, the student must have included Greek at 200 level, Hebrew at 200 level and Biblical Studies at 300 level. The dean of the Faculty of Theology may, however, grant a student permission to do some required semester

courses during the honores study if the denomination of the student requires so for his/her theological training.

#### **Clarification**

- (i) Not all modules are necessarily presented every year. Candidates must consult the department and obtain approval before registering for papers.
- (ii) Exemption from the short dissertation may be granted if a candidate holds a year module or two semester modules in Greek or Hebrew, independent of any other degree modules; or if the candidate takes a year module or two semester modules in Greek or Hebrew concurrently with B.A. Hons. ### Information

This programme is aimed at students whose churches require post graduate professional training. It enables the student to proceed from a four year undergraduate programme to a professional Master's programme and obtain a high level of proficiency in all the theological disciplines. It empowers the student to operate in unknown situations where independent thought and decision making are expected of him/her.

### Admission

In order to be admitted to M.Div. degree programme, a student must be in possession of a professional or a four year interdisciplinary B.Th. degree or an interdisciplinary B.A. Hons. (Theology) or an advanced B.Th. degree conferred by this university, or an equivalent qualification recognised by the Senate for this purpose.

The curriculum for this degree extends over two academic years and the student must obtain at least 288 credits as prescribed.

### Degree cum laude

- (i) A combined mark of at least 75% must be obtained according to a calculation formula in which the credit value is used as a factor for calculation.
- (ii) In the mini-dissertation a mark of at least 70% must be obtained.

This depends on the route whereby a student normally arrives at the M.A. and M.Th. In the case of the M.A. the student usually had a hierarchically structured former training, that is, he/she started earlier specialising in only one or two theological subjects. In the case of the M.Th. the student was up to honores level evenly exposed to all the theological subjects. This difference entails that a broader range of possibilities can be offered in the M.Th. programmes.

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### Information

The programme offers specialised training in one theological discipline. The *structured* M.A. (Theology) differs from the *dissertation* M.A. (Theology) in that the student does less research, but is exposed to a wider spectrum of insights within the chosen discipline of specialisation. The outcome is that the student with this specialised knowledge can minister the gospel in the church with greater skill, and that he/she can apply for doctoral studies.

## Admission

In order to be admitted to master's degree studies, a candidate must hold an B.A. Hons. degree in theology or an equivalent qualification with specialisation in one of the disciplines.
